Birth month reviews

We are in the process of introducing a system of birth month reviews such that patients requiring an annual review of their long term conditions will be sent a letter in their birth month. We will try to combine appointments to reduce the number of times you may need to attend the practice.

e-consult

We encourage patients to use econsult, on the home page of our website, for straightforward administrative requests such as sick notes. However, if patients use this mechanism to request services which incur a charge, that charge will still be applicable.

Waiting times

We try to offer appointments at varying times through the day and allow some flexibility in booking. However, we do not have infinite resources and must allow our clinicians to practice safely. There can sometimes be a wait to see the clinician of your choice but we will always ensure you can see someone or speak with someone if you feel your problem cannot wait.
